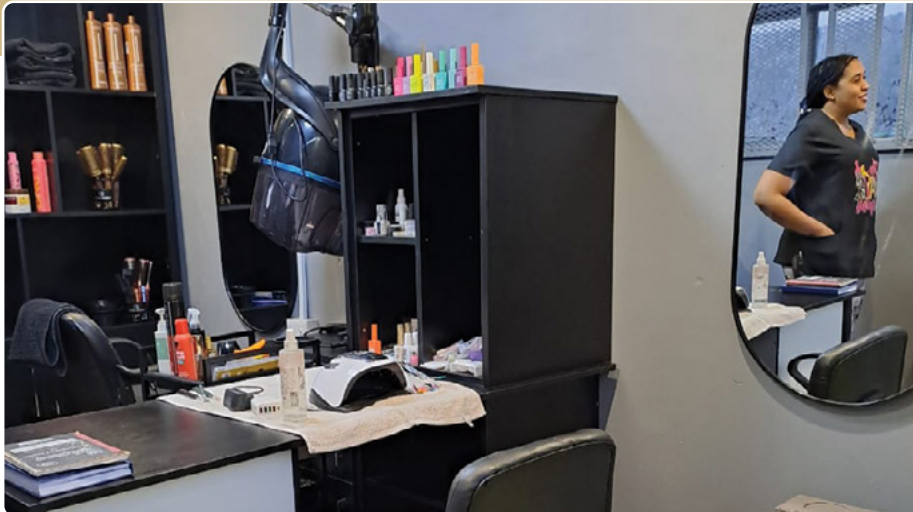




ALL WOMEN IN BUSINESS INITIATIVE EMPOWERS



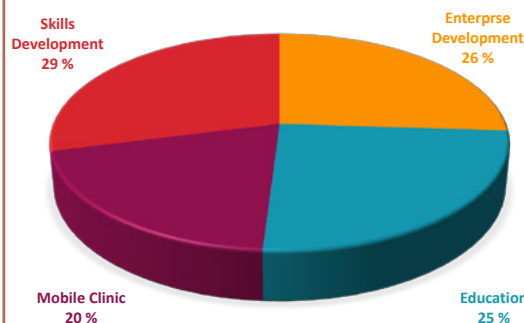
